Finding More Purpose in Advent

Grace to you friends. As we enter into the season of Advent, we all have different customs to help us prepare for the incarnation of our savior. Making Advent wreaths is a wonderful example. This year, I invite you to consider the ideas below taken from Family Traditions for the season of Advent, What We Do in Advent: An Anglican Kids' Activity Book, by The Rev. Anne E. Kitch.

Saying Grace Together

If your family doesn't have a tradition of saying grace, now is a great time to start. Pick one meal a day and try to say grace at that meal for each day during Advent. You can read a grace from The Book of Common Prayer (look at page 835), use your own words to thank God for your food, or go around the table and each say one thing that you are grateful for that day. Also make time to remember those in need and the lonely ones during this most hopeful season.

Praying Together

Make time once a week to pray together as a family. Express your joys and your concerns, and ask God for guidance and blessing. If you haven't taught your children the Lord's Prayer, the season of Advent is a wonderful time to learn. One of my favorite prayers in the prayer book is said in our house when our boys go to bed. It begins "Keep watch, dear Lord..." (look on page 134 in The Book of Common Prayer).

Reading Scripture Together

Advent is a time to grow closer to God, to pay more attention to God by simplifying our lives and reminding ourselves of God's great love and mercy towards us. What better way to grow closer to God than reading the Bible? Start small if it seems daunting. The Book of Common Prayer has some appropriate passages that you can say together every night. The Song of Mary (page 119) or the Third Song of Isaiah (page 87) are especially appropriate in Advent. If you do have a tradition of reading the Bible together, consider praying the Daily Devotionals are on page 137, or the Daily Office like Katie and I do.

Proclaim the Gospel in Word and Deed

As a family, find a project that will shine the light of Christ to the world. Here are some suggestions of how to love your neighbor as yourself:

- Count how many pairs of shoes or coats you have and see if you might have an extra pair you could donate to someone in need. Add some socks and underwear for good measure!
- Consider caroling with your parish family for our shut ins.
- Consider getting an envelope for shopping for someone at CARE Lodge. The envelopes for parents and adults who have had a really tough year are always the last to be taken.
- Give up eating out once a week and donate the money to the Episcopal Relief & Development Fund.
- Volunteer at an animal shelter. Collect blankets and donate them to a shelter.
- Care for God's creation by taking a lead on how St. Paul's can help with our carbon footprint or start a compost for a garden next spring.
- Invite a lonely classmate to eat with you at the lunch table at school.
- When you are filling out your Christmas cards, send one or more to:
 - —A resident of a local nursing home, residential care facility or a patient in a hospital.
 - —A Recovering American Soldier, c/o Walter Reed, National Military Medical Center.

The Good Deeds Jar

Put a jar on the kitchen counter next to a bowl of dried black-eyed peas. During Advent, any family member who performs a good deed, such as folding someone else's laundry or making their bed, moves a pea into the jar. On Christmas Day, the peas are replaced with candy canes or some other favorite family candy item. Add a few more pieces of candy for good measure! During Christmas everyone is invited to talk about one of the nice things they did for someone else. The tradition reminds us that while you never have control over whether someone else does something nice for you, but you always have control over whether you do something kind for someone else.

Vestry Nominations Open

Tominations are open to elect three new members of the Vestry to serve three-year terms. Forms for nominations are available at the entrances to Nave and on the bulletin board in the hallway and will be accepted until January 20, 2025.

A potential vestry member must be a confirmed communicant, at least 21 years of age, must be canonically resident and actually residing in the parish (letter of membership on file); must be entitled to suffrage at annual meeting at which elected; cannot have served on the Vestry in previous three years (though such person is immediately eligible to stand for nomination as Warden); and shall not serve more than six consecutive years in that or a combination of vestry member/warden offices unless said individual has served a portion of a former term (i.e. filled an unexpired term).

Prior to the Annual Parish Meeting, potential Vestry members will meet with the Rector; consent to the parish's Vestry Covenant; and commit to attend the Annual Vestry retreat, which is scheduled for February 15, 2025.
