## "... grant us strength and courage to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart."

We know these words so well as we pray them after communion on most Sundays. And the phrase "with gladness and singleness of heart" is especially engrained in us because it speaks to how we commit to serving God in the world.

It turns out that this phrase comes from the second chapter of the Acts of the Apostles. Pentecost has happened, and then around three thousand are baptized. Then "with gladness and singleness of heart," or translated in another way, sincerity of heart, the first converts learn what it means to be the Body of Christ together. Among other things, they learn how they hold their



possessions in common and take care of each other.

This year's stewardship theme, With Gladness and Singleness of Heart, is a continuation of the Church in its earliest days. Those early converts were devoted to God and to one another as we are. We have the same call to give and be generous, not out of need but out of gladness and sincerity. This is one way we continue to be stewards of Christ's Church. It is how we carry out our mission to "share Christ's unconditional love with the broader community."

If you have any questions or would like to further discern making a financial pledge, please do not hesitate to reach out to your rector. Thank you for your faith-filled generosity now and always.




