Tt's that time of year again. Serving Christ's Church in

Ithe south (Province IV), staff lay out not just one but two calendars as we plan for the year. One, of course, is the church calendar. When is All Saints' Sunday? When will our Bishop preside? When does Advent begin, and Mother Katie and I can look awesome in those beautiful blue vestments?

And then there is the other very important calendar. Who does Ole Miss play this weekend? And yes, I consider State and 'Bama, too. Who is home this week? Who travels away and is it a night game? When can we recommend to the Vestry a date for our annual parish picnic?

And this is not all. The Church no longer owns Sunday. Travel teams. Cheer. Matinee shows in theaters. All kinds of things stretch our families every week and just making it to Church on Sunday morning is a success for so many of us. I look out from behind God's table every week and see the fatigue in your eyes. Showing up for one another is an incredible expression of love. I see you and you are so loved.

And, while the pandemic was years ago now, some habits have changed too. The way we participate in our institutions; how we give our time is different now than before. And these habits don't seem to be going away anytime soon.

So, we are not making changes as much as we are adapting. The world and the Spirit are already moving, and the Church is merely catching up. We, the Body of Christ, must be flexible and responsive, because the world is ever evolving.

Yet, change is hard for all of us. The concept of change often carries connotations of disruption or challenge, but change can also be a profound expression of love; a deep commitment to care for the community in meaningful and relevant ways. If the Church is "sharing Christ's love with the broader community" as our mission statement says, we must show love by meeting people where they are and address their current needs.

This is what we are doing. We are responding. We are making changes as expressions of love. We moved our family formation to Wednesday

nights after dinner. We have tabled children's chapel for a season and have set up a PrayGround. It is under our stained-glass window depicting Jesus saying to the people "Let the children come to me." We have more resources for children including children's worship bulletins, children's books, soft toys and more, all to equip them to worship as full members of the Body.

We are committed to show love in this way for several reasons. Our faithful but few volunteers for Sunday School and Children's Chapel are exhausted. Recruiting new volunteers and getting a commitment has proved increasingly difficult. Moving family Formation to Continues





I am writing with news of some staff changes at Allin House.

After nearly nine years on the Diocesan staff, the Rev. Canon Brian Ponder will begin a well-deserved sabbatical. Brian returned to his home diocese in 2011, after having served in the Diocese of West Tennessee, and accepted the call to serve as Rector of St. Paul's Church in Meridian. In October 2015, Brian joined the staff at Allin House as Canon for Finance and Administration, and he assumed the role of Canon to the Ordinary in December 2022. His service to the Diocese of Mississippi began when he was a college-aged staff member in Allin House under Bishop Marble. I know that you join me in thanking Brian for his faithful service to this Diocese, as a priest and pastor, and as a member of the Diocesan staff, and we envelop him in prayers as he rests and renews. A letter from Brian to the Diocese is also attached.

The Rev. Canon Zabron A. ("Chip") Davis will serve as Interim Canon to the Ordinary. Chip, a long-time priest of this Diocese who serves as Executive Director of Gray Center + Camp Bratton-Green (with the unfailing support of his wife, Cathy), was Canon to the Ordinary in the Diocese of West Tennessee for ten years, serving under Bishops Don Johnson and Phoebe Roaf. Chip brings a wealth of experience to the role and will be of enormous help to the staff during the transition. You can reach Chip at cdavis@dioms.org.

Lastly, we wish Chief Financial Officer David Martin well as he begins exploring new opportunities. I am prayerfully discerning the return to a staff model which includes a Canon for Finance and Administration. In the interim, we will engage the services of a CPA firm to help with the preparation of financial statements, budget forecasting and other needs. Review of records and plans for needed audits are currently underway, and we hope that a relatively seamless transition will be forthcoming.

I thank you for your patience and ask for your continued prayers during this time of transition, as our Diocesan staff moves toward greater efficiency in our operations. I'll still be out visiting our worshipping communities, and hearing from you and all of our Diocese – whom we serve – as we continue to discern how God calls us all to grow in love and serve our neighbors in the communities in which we are planted.
