This is how a seminary professor of mine started every session of class. These words invited us to be still and remember Christ in the midst of a busy school day. That holy stillness was disrupting. It disrupted the silly conversations we had with our classmates. It disrupted

the frantic, lastsecond studying we tried to cram in before a test. Welcomed or not, being forced to press pause on whatever we were doing and remember the myriad of ways Jesus is present with us.


There are times where it is easier to feel connected to the

on me, Lord, because I cry out to you all day long."


