An Offering Before God

Thope you are enjoying a good use Lof leisure and travel in these hot Mississippi summer months. I am so thankful for your grace as we worship in All Saints' Hall while the work is done this month in the nave of removing the carpet and repairing the kneelers.

I often find myself looking for days where we celebrate a particular saint and sharing their story. This July, I am drawn to St. Macrina the Younger, named after her grandmother, who was a monastic and teacher in the late 300s. She is one of those who could have easily

been overlooked by the fame of her family and in this case her sainted family. She is sister to St. Basil the Great, St. Peter of Sebaste, and St. Gregory of Nyssa and dear friend of St. Gregory of Nazianzus, which three make up the better known "Cappadocian Fathers." The story of those is for another day but what is important is that none of these would be where they are without the guiding Spirit and humility of blessed Macrina.

Macrina, at a young age, was set to marry, but her would be husband died. She then convinced her mom to start a monastery on their family's estate in the Cappadocian city of Pontus. The emphasis of this community was care of the poor, the sick, and the starving.

She made her life there and friends and family sought out her advice throughout her life. She was the older sibling who challenged her brothers and was not afraid



to speak the truth in love when they needed it. She told Gregory his fame was not due to his own merit, but to the prayers of his parents. She took Basil in hand when returned from Athens "monstrously conceited about his skill in rhetoric." Even when her brothers became bishops and leaders in the orthodox and Nicene faith, she was their council in need who would because of her gender probably have been forgotten if not for her brothers giving her credit.

Gregory came to Macrina in her last days and found her lying on some wooden planks on the floor. He

recorded her last words and prayers in his Life of St. Macrina. From *The Life of St. Macrina*, by St. Gregory of Nyssa:

"Her couch had been turned towards the East; and, ceasing to converse with us, she spoke henceforward to God in prayer, making supplication with her hands and whispering with a low voice, so that we could just hear what was said. Such was the prayer; we need not doubt that it reached God and that she, too, was hearing God's voice.

'You, O Lord, has freed us from the fear of death. You have made the end of this life the beginning to us of true life. You for a season rest our bodies in sleep and awake them again at the last trump. You give our earth, which you have fashioned with your hands, to the earth to keep in safety. One day you wilt take again what you have given, transfiguring with immortality

Continued from front page and grace our mortal and unsightly remains. You have saved us from the curse and from sin, having become both for our sakes...

Your mercies, remember me, too, in your kingdom; because I, too, was crucified with you, having nailed my flesh to the cross for fear of you, and of Thy judgments have I been afraid. Let not the terrible chasm separate me from your elect. Nor let the Slanderer stand against me in the way; nor let my sin be found before your eyes, if in anything I have sinned in word or deed or thought, led astray by the weakness of our nature. O you who have power on earth to forgive sins, forgive me, that I may be refreshed and may be found before you when I put off my body, without defilement on my soul. But may my soul be received into your hands spotless and undefiled, as an offering before you.'

As she said these words she sealed her eyes and mouth and heart with the cross. And gradually her tongue dried up with the fever, she could articulate her words no longer, and her voice died away, and only by the trembling of her lips and the motion of her hands did we recognize that she was praying."

We give thanks for those like Macrina in our midst. We give thanks for those who are faithful to the last breath. We give thanks for those who use their resources for the way of Love. Finally, we give thanks for those who have the courage to give us tough love when we need it.

Merciful God, who called your servant
Macrina to reveal in her life and her teaching
the riches of your grace and truth: May we,
following her example, seek after your wisdom
and life according to her way; through Jesus
Christ our Savior, who lives and reigns with you
and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
Amen.
